Report on review of interim condensed consolidated financial information

To the board of directors of National Industries Group Holding – KPSC Kuwait

Introduction

We have reviewed the accompanying interim condensed consolidated statement of financial position of National Industries Group Holding - Kuwaiti Public Shareholding Company (the "Parent Company") and its subsidiaries (together referred to as "the Group") as of 30 June 2025 and the related interim condensed consolidated statements of profit or loss and profit or loss and other comprehensive income for the three-month and six-month periods then ended, and interim condensed consolidated statements of changes in equity and cash flows for the six-month period then ended. Management is responsible for the preparation and presentation of this interim condensed consolidated financial information in accordance with International Accounting Standard 34, "Interim Financial Reporting". Our responsibility is to express a conclusion on this interim condensed consolidated financial information based on our review.

Scope of Review

We conducted our review in accordance with International Standard on Review Engagements 2410, "Review of Interim Financial Information Performed by the Independent Auditor of the Entity." A review of interim financial information consists of making inquiries, primarily of persons responsible for financial and accounting matters, and applying analytical and other review procedures. A review is substantially less in scope than an audit conducted in accordance with International Standards on Auditing and consequently does not enable us to obtain assurance that we would become aware of all significant matters that might be identified in an audit. Accordingly, we do not express an audit opinion.

Conclusion

Based on our review, nothing has come to our attention that causes us to believe that the accompanying interim condensed consolidated financial information is not prepared, in all material respects, in accordance with International Accounting Standard 34, "Interim Financial Reporting".

Report on review of other legal and regulatory requirements

Based on our review, the interim condensed consolidated financial information is in agreement with the books of the Parent Company. We further report that, to the best of our knowledge and belief, no violation of the Companies Law No. 1 of 2016 and its Executive Regulations, or of the Parent Company's Memorandum of Incorporation and Articles of Association, as amended, have occurred during the six-month period ended 30 June 2025 that might have had a material effect on the business or financial position of the Parent Company.

We further report that, during the course of our review, we have not become aware of any material violations of the provision of law no. 7 of 2010 concerning the Capital Markets Authority and its related regulations during the six-month period ended 30 June 2025 that might have had a material effect on the business or financial position of the Parent Company.

1 General information and nature of operations

National Industries Group Holding – KPSC ("the Parent Company") was incorporated in 1961 as a Kuwaiti shareholding company in accordance with the Commercial Companies Law in the State of Kuwait and, in April 2003, its legal status was changed to a "Holding Company". The Parent Company along with its subsidiaries are jointly referred to as "the Group". The Parent Company's shares are traded on the Kuwait Stock Exchange and Dubai Financial Market.

The main objectives of the Parent Company are as follows:

- Owning stocks and shares in Kuwaiti or non-Kuwaiti shareholding companies and shares in Kuwaiti or non-Kuwaiti limited liability companies and participating in the establishment of, lending to and managing of these companies and acting as a guarantor for these companies.
- Lending money to companies in which it owns 20% or more of the capital of the borrowing company, along with acting as guarantor on behalf of these companies.
- Owning industrial equities such as patents, industrial trademarks, royalties, or any other related rights, and
 franchising them to other companies or using them within or outside the State of Kuwait.
- Owning real estate and moveable property to conduct its operations within the limits as stipulated by law.
- Employing excess funds available by investing them in investment and real estate portfolios managed by specialised companies.

The address of the Parent Company's registered office is PO Box 417, Safat 13005, State of Kuwait.

The Board of Directors of the Parent Company approved this interim condensed consolidated financial information for issue on 5 August 2025.

2 Basis of preparation

The interim condensed consolidated financial information of the Group for the six-month period ended 30 June 2025 has been prepared in accordance with International Accounting Standard 34 "Interim Financial Reporting".

The annual consolidated financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2024 were prepared in accordance with the IFRS Accounting Standards as issued by the International Accounting Standards Board ("IASB").

The interim condensed consolidated financial information has been presented in Kuwaiti Dinars which is the functional and presentation currency of the Parent Company.

The interim condensed consolidated financial information does not include all information and disclosures required for complete financial statements prepared in accordance with the IFRS Accounting Standards. In the opinion of the Group's management, all adjustments consisting of normal recurring accruals considered necessary for a fair presentation have been included.

Operating results for the six-month period ended 30 June 2025 are not necessarily indicative of the results that may be expected for the financial year ending 31 December 2025. For further details, refer to the consolidated financial statements and its related disclosures for the year ended 31 December 2024.

3 Changes in accounting policies

The accounting polices used in the preparation of this interim condensed consolidated financial information are consistent with those used in the preparation of the annual consolidated financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2024, except for the adoption of the new and amended IFRS Accounting Standards effective as of 1 January 2025 as described in Note 3.1. The Group has not early adopted any standard, interpretation or amendment that has been issued but is not yet effective.

3.1 New and amended IFRS Accounting Standards adopted by the Group

The following amendments to IAS 21 were effective for the current period:

IAS 21 Amendments - Lack of exchangeability

The amendments to IAS 21 addresses determination of exchange rate when there is long term lack of exchangeability. The amendments:

- Specify when a currency is exchangeable into another currency and when it is not a currency is
 exchangeable when an entity is able to exchange that currency for the other currency through markets or
 exchange mechanisms that create enforceable rights and obligations without undue delay at the
 measurement date and for a specified purpose; a currency is not exchangeable into the other currency if an
 entity can only obtain an insignificant amount of the other currency.
- Specify how an entity determines the exchange rate to apply when a currency is not exchangeable when a currency is not exchangeable at the measurement date, an entity estimates the spot exchange rate as the rate that would have applied to an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date and that would faithfully reflect the economic conditions prevailing.
- Require the disclosure of additional information when a currency is not exchangeable when a currency is not exchangeable an entity discloses information that would enable users of its financial statements to evaluate how a currency's lack of exchangeability affects, or is expected to affect, its financial performance, financial position and cash flows.

The adoption of the amendments did not have a significant impact on the Group's interim condensed consolidated financial information.

4 Judgement and estimates

The preparation of interim condensed consolidated financial information requires management to make judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the application of accounting policies and the reported amounts of assets and liabilities, income and expense. Actual results may differ from these estimates.

In preparing this interim condensed consolidated financial information, the significant judgements made by management in applying the Group's accounting policies and the key sources of estimation uncertainty were the same as those that applied to the annual audited consolidated financial statements as at and for the year ended 31 December 2024.

5 Basic and diluted earnings per share

Basic and diluted earnings per share is calculated by dividing the profit for the period attributable to the owners of the Parent Company by the weighted average number of shares outstanding during the period as follows:

18 Fair value measurement

18.1 Fair value hierarchy

Fair value represents the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date.

Financial assets and financial liabilities measured at fair value in the interim condensed consolidated statement of financial position are grouped into six levels of a fair value hierarchy. The six levels are defined based on the observability of significant inputs to the measurement, as follows:

- Level 1 fair value measurements are those derived from quoted prices (unadjusted) in active markets for identical assets or liabilities;
- Level 2 fair value measurements are those derived from inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability, either directly (i.e. as prices) or indirectly (i.e. derived from prices); and
- Level 3 fair value measurements are those derived from valuation techniques that include inputs for the asset or liability that are not based on observable market data (unobservable inputs).

Measurement at fair value

The Group's finance team performs valuations of financial items for financial reporting purposes, including Level 3 fair values, in consultation with third party valuation specialists for complex valuations, where required. Valuation techniques are selected based on the characteristics of each instrument, with the overall objective of maximizing the use of market-based information.

The methods and valuation techniques used for the purpose of measuring fair values, are unchanged compared to the previous reporting period/year.

18.2 Fair value measurement of financial instruments (continued)

a) Quoted securities

Quoted securities represent all listed equity securities which are publicly traded in stock exchanges. Where quoted prices in an active market are available, the fair value of such investments have been determined by reference to their quoted bid prices at the reporting date (Level 1).

b) Unquoted securities (Level 2 and 3)

The consolidated financial statements include investments in unlisted securities which are measured at fair value. Fair value is estimated using discounted cash flow model or observable market prices or other valuation techniques which include some assumptions that are not supportable by observable market prices or rates.

c) Managed portfolios and funds

Private equity funds (Level 3)

The underlying investments in these private equity funds mainly represent foreign quoted and unquoted securities. Information for these investments is limited to periodic financial reports provided by the investment managers. These investments are carried at net asset values reported by the investment managers. Due to the nature of these investments, the net asset values reported by the investment managers represent the best estimate of fair values available for these investments.

Other managed portfolios and funds (Level 2 and 3)

The underlying investments of international managed portfolios and funds represent quoted and unquoted securities. They are valued based on periodic reports received from the portfolio/fund managers.

d) Debt securities

The consolidation financial statements include holding in unlisted debt securities which are measured at fair value. Fair value of such investments have been determined by reference to their observable prices, other than quoted, at the reporting date.

Measurement at fair value

19 Fiduciary assets

One of the subsidiaries of the Group manages mutual funds, portfolios on behalf of related and third parties, and maintains securities in fiduciary accounts which are not reflected in the interim condensed consolidated statement of financial position. Assets under management at 30 June 2025 amounted to KD4,690 thousand (31 December 2024: KD1,945 thousand and 30 June 2024: KD2,999 thousand) of which assets managed on behalf of the related parties amounted to KD4,658 thousand (31 December 2024: KD1,906 thousand and 30 June 2024: KD2,960 thousand).

20 Contingent liabilities and commitments

At 30 June 2025, the Group had contingent liabilities in respect of outstanding bank guarantees amounting to KD95,655 thousand (31 December 2024: KD82,193 thousand and 30 June 2024: KD54,745 thousand).

At the reporting date, the Group had commitments for the purchase of investments, the acquisition of property, plant and equipment and investment properties and the incorporation of investment in associates totalling KD26,449 thousand (31 December 2024: KD27,484 thousand and 30 June 2024: KD18,493 thousand).

21 Legal cases

The significant legal cases of the Group are summarised below:

a) One of the Group's subsidiaries has filed legal cases against one of its customers regarding gross trade receivables of KD112,246 thousand. These receivables are recorded in the Group's consolidated financials at their acquisition fair values.

During prior period, the court of First Instance ruled in favor of the subsidiary in one of the cases; however, the ruling has been appealed. The subsidiary's management, in consultation with its legal advisors, remains confident that a favourable verdict is probable and that the full balance along with additional compensation will be recovered.

The litigations are at its initial stages and the final outcome cannot be determined at present.

b) During the previous years, the General Manager of the Public Authority for Industry in Kuwait, in his official capacity, initiated legal proceedings against one of the Group's subsidiaries, seeking eviction from a non-contracted plot of land. The claim also demanded a payment of KD20,038 thousand for the subsidiary usage of the land since 1 April 2007, along with any associated fees and expenses.

After consulting with an external legal counsel, the subsidiary's management believes that it is not liable for any financial obligations related to the land as no contractual agreements exist between the subsidiary and the government entity. The subsidiary's management intends to strongly defend its position and, based on their consultation with their external legal counsel, remains confident that the claim can be successfully contested.

Certain details required in accordance with IAS 37 - Provisions, Contingent Liabilities and Contingent Assets, are not disclosed to prevent any potential prejudice to the litigation's outcome.

Subsequent to the reporting date, the Court of First Instance issued a ruling in favor of the Public Authority for Industry, ordering the subsidiary to vacate the 402,000 square meters located in the Western Shuaiba Industrial Area, which is owned by the Authority, and to pay an amount of KD3,471 thousands, in addition to daily rent of KD1,377 effective from 1 April 2024 until the evacuation is completed, along with attorney's fees. This ruling, however, has no financial impact on the Group's consolidated financial statements, as an adequate provision has already been recognized to cover this obligation. The subsidiary's management intends to file an appeal against the ruling.

22 Taxation

In 2021, OECD's Inclusive Framework (IF) on Base Erosion and Profit Shifting (BEPS) had agreed to a two-pillar solution in order to address tax challenges arising from digitalization of the economy. Law No. 157 of 2024 was enacted by the government of Kuwait which governs the taxation of multinational enterprise (MNEs) groups operating in the State of Kuwait, the jurisdiction in which the Parent Company is incorporated, effective from 1 January 2025. It applies to MNEs operating in Kuwait with annual consolidated revenues of EUR 750 million or more in at least two of the four preceding fiscal years (revenue threshold) based on the consolidated financial statements of the ultimate parent entity (UPE). The law, which aims to ensure that MNEs pay tax at an effective tax rate of 15% on their Kuwait profits, introduced a domestic minimum top-up tax (DMTT) that is aligned with the Pillar Two Model Rules.

On 29 June 2025, Kuwait's Ministry of Finance (MOF) issued the Executive Regulations ("the Regulation") for the Law No. 157 of 2024. The Regulations aim to interpret and clarify the provisions of the above law, define procedures and implementation mechanisms, and provide a clear understanding for all relevant parties. To provide certainty to taxpayers and enhance consistency with the Model Rules, Article 116 of the Regulations require the Regulations to be applied and interpreted in line with the Model Rules and consolidated commentary.

Since the Regulations were recently issued on 29 June 2025, the Group is still reviewing its applicability, not limited to reviewing if it meets the revenue threshold, and hence if any impact whilst considering all the relevant provisions of the Regulations.

23 Events after reporting date

No significant events have occurred that would require disclosure or adjustment in the interim condensed consolidated financial information from the reporting date up to the date this interim condensed consolidated financial information was authorized for issue.

24 Comparative information

Certain other comparative figures have been reclassified to conform to the presentation in the current period, and such reclassification does not affect previously reported net assets, net equity and net results for the period or net decrease in cash and cash equivalents.
