Report on Review of Interim Condensed Consolidated Financial Information to the Board of Directors

Introduction

1. Incorporation and activities

The Parent Company is a Kuwaiti Public Shareholding Company registered and incorporated in Kuwait on 14 January 1979 whose shares are listed on the Kuwait Stock Exchange and the Dubai Financial Market. The Parent Company is engaged in investing activities in both local and international markets as set forth in Article No. 5 of the Parent Company's Articles of Association. The Parent Company is regulated by the Capital Market Authority ("CMA").

The registered office of the Parent Company is located at Al—Raya Tower 2, Floor 45, Abdulaziz Al-Saqer Street, P.O. Box 25825 Safat Kuwait.

During subsequent period, the Parent Company has increased its stake in the capital of Al Ahlia Chemicals Company K.S.C.C. from 62.6% to 99.4%, the group purchased a stake of 36.8% with an amount of KD 1,390,221.

2. Basis of preparation and material accounting policy information

2.1 Basis of preparation

This interim condensed consolidated financial information has been prepared in accordance with International Accounting Standard No. (34), "Interim Financial Reporting".

The interim condensed consolidated financial information does not include all information and disclosures required for complete financial statements in accordance with International Financial Reporting Standards.

In the management's opinion, all necessary adjustments, including recurring accruals have been included in the interim condensed consolidated financial information for fair presentation. The operating results for the period ended 30 Jun 2025 are not necessarily indicative of results that may be expected for the year ending 31 December 2025. For further information, refer to the consolidated financial statements and its related notes for the year ended 31 December 2024.

2.2 Material accounting policy information

The accounting policies used in the preparation of these interim condensed consolidated financial information are consistent with those used in the preparation of the annual consolidated financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2024, except for the adoption of the amendments revised IFRS which are effective for annual reporting period starting from 1 January 2025 and did not result in any material impact on the accounting policies, financial position or performance of the Group.

The Group has not applied any standards, interpretations or amendments that have been issued but not yet effective.

- During 2018, the Group has acquired low-credit impaired debt instruments ("Sukuk") at contractual value amounted to KD 10.5M. The Group's management expects at initial recognition obtaining net future cash flows amounting to KD 9,850,000. Present value of debt instruments acquired based on discounted cash flows, was estimated by using discount rate of 6%.
- The Management expects to obtain net cash flows through the execution on certain properties, owned by the Issuing entity of Sukuk "issuer", seized in favor of the Group and other creditors. The execution has been performed for a part of seized properties and consideration of sale was collected by Execution Department at court. During the current period the group collected an amount of KD 2,545,872 From the execution department.
- During 2024, the Sukuk issuing company has filed an application to the bankruptcy judge in order to initiate the protective settlement procedures "Application". The bankruptcy judge issued a decision to reject the protective settlement procedures. The execution of the seized properties has been postponed for Session of the General Court to announce for Sale and Publication dated 1 October 2025. During the current period the Sukuk issuer company has filed an application "restructure plan" to the bankruptcy judge to initiate the restructure plan procedures "Application", For which there will be a court session dated 4 November 2025.

20. Legal cases

The judgements were issued by Court of Appeal and Court of Cassation in favor of the Group concerning the lawsuits of nullifying the share capital increase as well as a call for holding the extraordinary general assembly meeting relating to a subsidiary owned by 62.6%. In addition, there are first instance judgments in favor of the Group in one of the related lawsuits deliberated before Capital Markets Court. Based on the Attorney's opinion, it is likely that all lawsuits shall be adjudicated in favor of the Group. The net carrying amount of investment in the Subsidiary is amounting to KD 4 million approximately as at 30 June 2025.
